 emergency scene


Grants Awarded

Fire Safety and Prevention Grant

SAFER

Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response





 A 3-year grant to fund the hiring of nine (9) limited term, full-time
 Firefighters.

YCFD

 The total program is valued at \$2,483,244

2017 Homeland Security Grant



- Funding from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security
- Received funding of approximately
 - \$39,500
- Purchased
 - A set of vehicle extrication tools for New Fire Engine 2
 - 2 Automatic External Defibrillators (AED)

2018 Homeland Security Grant



Funding from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security

- 6 New gas monitors
 - 5 for Fire Engines
 - 1 for the Battalion Chief's vehicle.
- 12 dry suits for the Department's Water Rescue team.
- Value of the proposed purchases is \$23,000
- Anticipate approval in October 2018

Grants Pending

- Funding from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security
 - Funding to purchase a new Fire Safety Training House.
 - Replace our existing Fire Safety House
 - Goal, to increase public awareness of fire and life safety hazards
 - Cooking hazards
 - Electrical safety
 - Fire extinguishers
 - Smoke alarms and carbon monoxide devices
 - Fire safety and escape planning
