



Prop. 68 Per Capita Program Allocation Opportunity



Background:

 Proposition 68 passed by California voters via Senate Bill 5 in 2018.

- Two programs that provide funding:
 - Urban County Per Capita Program
 - General Per Capita Program



General Per Capita Program

 Allocation of funds are based on population. Yuba City is eligible for \$177,985.

 Funds are available for local park rehabilitation, creation, and improvements to address deficiencies in neighborhoods lacking access to the outdoors.

Funds cannot be spent on operations, maintenance or repairs.




Staff's Recommendation

 Spend the grant funds towards the development of a new water feature that replaces the existing water feature at Gauche Aquatic Park.
