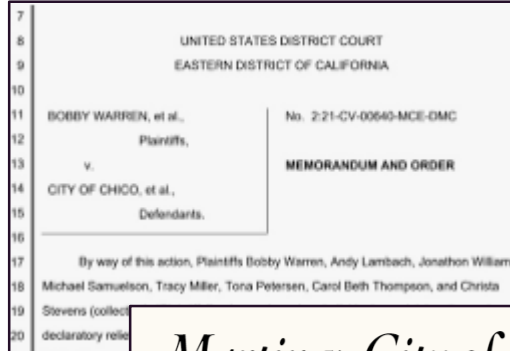

The PIT (Point in Time) Count

According to the most recent 2019 PIT count, 519 unsheltered live in Sutter County.

The PIT count does not disaggregate out Yuba City homeless from Sutter County homeless.

Officer Koski has regular contact with approximately 75 homeless who sleep in business doorways and on private property.

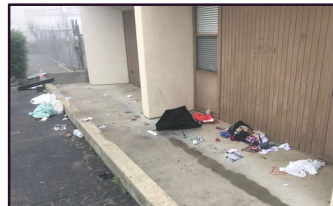
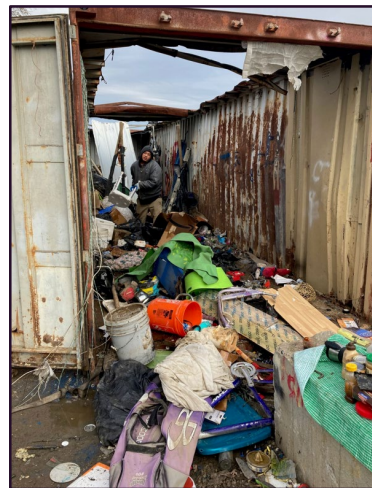

Common Behaviors Among the Homeless in Yuba City

In the City of Yuba City



-they typically stay within the same area; they can't travel too far

-they stay in the same area because they know where to get their food, money, and know where to sleep

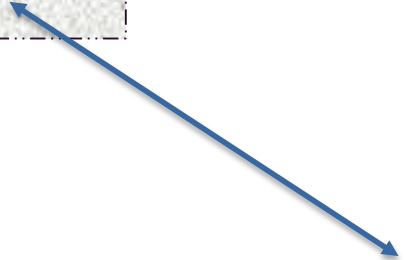
-they can't plan for tomorrow; they survive for today

-some tend to be hoarders having one or more carts

-some only have the clothes on their backs

-they don't shower or wash their clothes regularly

-they have severe or chronic mental health issues and drug/alcohol addictions

Historical Statistics of Transient Calls for Service

Understanding how the statistics were determined:

- the total number of calls for service were counted
- then the number of transient calls were extracted from the total number
- a 30-minute call time was used to determine the cost for each service call
- each call had two officers responding
- the median salary from the officer's salary schedule was used to determine the cost of transient calls
