<u>Summary</u>

Subject:	Millennium Family Entertainment - Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control Application
Recommendation:	Adopt a Resolution making a finding of public convenience or necessity for the issuance of a Type 40 (on-sale beer) Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) License at 901 Spiva Avenue, Suite A (Millennium Family Entertainment Center)
Fiscal Impact:	No direct fiscal impact will result from recommending approval of the proposed Alcoholic Beverage Control application

Purpose:

Consideration to make a finding of public convenience or necessity for the issuance of a Type 40 (onsale beer) Alcoholic Beverage Control License at 901 Spiva Avenue, Suite A (Millennium Family Entertainment Center).

Council's Strategic Goal:

This item aligns with City Council's Strategic Goal of being Business Friendly.

Background:

The City has received an application from John and Patricia Buckland, who own the Millennium Family Entertainment Center located at 901 Spiva Avenue, Suite A, which is approximately 796 feet east of the intersection of Gray and Spiva Avenues and approximately 800 feet east of the Gray Avenue Middle School property. They are requesting a Type 40 (on-sale beer) license from the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control. The application states the applicant has a current Type 41 (Restaurant Beer and Wine) license that will be inactivated in exchange for the Type 40 license. The reason for the change is a Type 41 license requires food service (similar to a restaurant) whereas the operation is moving to snack-based food offerings. This change will eliminate wine as a potential offering to customers, and if approved, the Type 40 (on-site beer) license sales are anticipated to amount to less than 1 percent of gross sales. Since the Type 41 License is only being inactivated, they may choose to reactivate it in the future depending on customer food service needs. The current proposal allows Millennium Family Entertainment's operation to be consistent with ABC requirements.

When ABC receives an application for a location where a high concentration of licenses exists, and/or a

crime rate exceeding 25% of the average, the local government is required to approve the application, prior to ABC approving it. In this instance, Millennium Family Entertainment Center's application states the census tract in which it is located currently has eleven (11) active ABC licenses where three (3) are allowed. This location is in Yuba City Police Beat No. 4.

<u>Analysis:</u>

Millennium Family Entertainment is open until 10pm on Fridays and Saturdays and 8pm on other evenings. The ABC and State Business and Professions Code, Section 23958, states the governing body must determine that the approval of this license would provide public convenience or necessity, in order for the license application to be approved by ABC in this location due to the number of existing licenses that exist within the Census block.

Development Services staff and Police Chief Baker have reviewed the application and believe this facility, including the sale of beer, is standard in this type of business and that public convenience is provided through the sale of beer at this business location.

Fiscal Impact:

No direct fiscal impact will result from making a finding of public convenience and necessity for the issuance of a Type 40 (on-sale beer) Alcoholic Beverage Control License at 901 Spiva Avenue, Suite A in Yuba City.

Alternatives:

Do not make a finding of public convenience and necessity for the issuance of a Type 41 restaurant beer and wine Alcoholic Beverage Control License at 901 Spiva Avenue, Suite A in Yuba City (Millennium Family Entertainment).

Recommendation:

Adopt a Resolution making a finding of public convenience or necessity for the issuance of a Type 40 (on-sale beer) Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) License at 901 Spiva Avenue, Suite A (Millennium Family Entertainment Center).

RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF YUBA CITY MAKING A FINDING OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY FOR THE ISSUANCE OF A TYPE 40 (ON-SALE BEER) ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL (ABC) LICENSE AT 901 SPIVA AVENUE, SUITE A, YUBA CITY (MILLENNIUM FAMILY ENTERTAINMENT)

WHEREAS, pursuant to applicable provisions of the Business and Professions Code, the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (hereinafter the "ABC") is charged with the responsibility of reviewing applications and issuance of licenses for the sale and/or manufacture of alcoholic beverages in the State of California; and

WHEREAS, Section 23958 of the Business and Professions Code provides that the ABC shall deny an application for a license if issuance of that license would tend to create a law enforcement problem, or if issuance would result in or add to an undue concentration of licenses, except as provided in Section 23958.4 of said Business and Professions Code; and

WHEREAS, Section 23958.4 of the Business and Professions Code provides that, notwithstanding the limitations of Section 23958, the ABC shall issue a license if the applicant shows that "public convenience or necessity" would be served by the issuance of such license; and

WHEREAS, the City of Yuba City has received an application for a Public Convenience and Necessity determination that was filed by John and Patricia Buckland, the ("Applicant") who is the owner of Millennium Family Entertainment located at 901 Spiva Avenue, Suite A, in Yuba City, requesting a letter of Public Convenience and Necessity to allow a Type 40 (on-sale beer) License in a census tract that has surpassed the number of allotted licenses and is located in Police Beat 4 which is not have a higher-than-average crime rate; and

WHEREAS, said Section 23958.4 further provides that the determination of "public convenience or necessity" shall be made by the local governing body of the area in which the applicant's premises are located with regard to certain applications, including on-site sales of alcohol at family entertainment center; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered this matter, and desires to find that the public convenience and necessity would be served by granting an additional Type 40 (on-sale beer) License for the location at 901 Spiva Avenue, Suite A, in Yuba City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Yuba City as follows:

- 1. The recitals and findings set forth above are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 2. The City Council finds that this matter is not a "project" for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) as it is merely a determination whether the public convenience and necessity would be served by the issuance of a Type 40 (on-sale beer) License for the location at 901 Spiva Avenue, Suite A (Millennium Family Entertainment).

It does not have a potential for resulting in a reasonably foreseeable physical change to the existing environment.

- 3. The City Council finds and determines the public convenience and necessity is met in the present circumstances for reasons including the following:
 - a. The alcohol sales for on-site consumption would be a limited, part of the overall establishment's service with limited hours from until 10:00pm on Fridays and Saturdays and earlier on other nights and subject to supervision as specified in the applicants letter which is incorporated by reference.
 - b. The request to permit beer sales for on-premise consumption in conjunction with this establishment will not adversely affect the surrounding land uses and the growth and development of the area because the use is compatible with the nearby developments, and consumption is limited to on-site.
 - c. The determination of Public Convenience or Necessity, under the conditions imposed, will not be detrimental to the health and safety of the citizens of the City of Yuba City.
- 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
