The City of Yuba City Council meeting was called to order by Mayor Cleveland at 6:01pm.

Mayor Cleveland delivered the invocation.

Curtis Grima led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Presentations & Proclamations

1. Emergency Preparedness Month – Proclamation

Mayor Cleveland presented the proclamation to Bill Fuller, Fire Administration Analyst who discussed the Rapid Notify Brochure.

2. Retirement Proclamation – Fire Battalion Chief Robert Stoddard

Mayor Cleveland presented a proclamation to Fire Battalion Chief Stoddard.

Public Hearings

3. Formation of a Community Facilities District (CFD No. 2017-01) to fund Municipal Services

Mayor Cleveland opened the public hearing. Hearing no comment from the public, Mayor Cleveland closed the public hearing.

Councilmember Cardoza moved and Councilmember Harris seconded the motion to adopt **Resolution 17-065** Formation of a Community Facilities District and to Levy a Special Tax in the City of Yuba City Community Facility District No. 2017-01 for Municipal Services. The vote was unanimous.

4. Bogue Road Rehabilitation Project (Bid Award)

Councilmember Buckland moved and Vice-Mayor Didbal seconded the motion to award Contract No. 14-05 Bogue Road Rehabilitation to Teichert Construction of Roseville, CA in the amount of their total bid of \$778,033 and to authorize the Finance Director to transfer \$70,000 from Account No. 1051 (Road Rehabilitation) to Account No. 1152 (Bogue Road Rehabilitation) and authorize the City Manager to execute the contract on behalf of the City, following approval by the City Attorney. The vote was unanimous.

5. Purchase of one (1) Digester Mixing Pump (FB18-06) (Bid Award)

Councilmember Cardoza moved and Councilmember Buckland seconded the motion to award the purchase of one (1) digester mixing pump to Gierlich Mitchell of Cypress, CA in the amount of \$51,844.65 and authorize the Finance Director to make a supplemental appropriation of \$51,844.65 from Unallocated Wastewater Funds to Account No. 8120-69201 (Capital Acquisition). The vote was unanimous.

6. Purchase of one (1) John Deere 1600 Wide Area Mower (Bid Award)

Vice-Mayor Didbal moved and Councilmember Cardoza seconded the motion to award the purchase of one (1) John Deere 1600 Wide Area Mower to Valley Truck and Tractor, Inc. of Yuba City, CA in the amount of \$49,950

Consent Calendar

Councilmember Cardoza moved and Councilmember Harris seconded the motion to approve the Consent Calendar as presented. The vote was unanimous.

Approved the City Council Meeting Minutes of August 15, 2017.

10. Adoption of formal City of Yuba City Risk Management Policy Statement

Approved **Resolution No. 17-066** adopting the City of Yuba City's Risk Management Policy.

11. Purchase of one (1) trailer for the Parks Department

Authorized a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$10,000 to purchase a trailer for the Parks Department through the Vehicle Replacement Fund.

12. Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) Application – Backup Generators at the Corporation Yard

Authorized the Public Works Director to submit an application for the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program in the amount of \$150,000 for the installation of backup generators at the Corporation Yard.

13. Purchase and Installation of Enterprise Data Storage Arrays at the Yuba City Police Department and City Hall

Approved the purchase of enterprise data storage arrays and installation from BigGreen IT of Rocklin, CA in the amount of \$205,000 with a 5% contingency for a not to exceed amount of \$215,250 with the finding that it is in the best interest of the City.

14. Renewal of Contract for ICMA-RC 457(b)

Adopted **Resolution No. 17-067** authorizing the City Manager to execute an updated Agreement with ICMA-RC to Administer the City's 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plan.

15. 2016 Homeland Security Grant Program – Vehicle Extrication Tool Purchase

Accepted the Award of the 2016 Homeland Security Grant in the amount of \$36,000 and approved supplemental budget appropriations to the Fire Department's Account No. 2327-69201 in the amount of \$36,000 for the purchase of one set of Hurst Vehicle extrication tools (Jaws of Life).

16. Conversion of Limited-term employees to permanent status

Adopted **Resolution No. 17-068** authorizing the conversion of current Fire Department SAFER Grant-funded, limited-term employees to permanent status to fill vacancies, as necessary, in the Fire Department, when there are budgeted positions vacant within the Department, and with the concurrence and approval of the City Manager.

General Items

17. Purchase of one (1) Type I Fire Engine and one (1) Rescue vehicle

Councilmember Buckland moved and Councilmember Harris seconded the motion to Authorize: A) the purchase of one Pierce Velocity Type I triple combination Pumper Fire Engine and one Ford F550 Fire Rescue unit with Cascade/Lighting system in the amount of \$868,913.67 from Pierce Manufacturing, Inc., of Appleton, Wisconsin, with the finding that it is in the best interest of the City: B) approve multiple equipment purchase 100% prepayment option discount of \$47,637.92; C) authorize an additional \$40,000 supplemental appropriation for computer, modem, fire hose and other miscellaneous equipment for both vehicles from Account No. 6610-69415; and D) authorize the Fire

Chief to execute the appropriate documentation with the National Purchasing Partners/Fire Rescue GPO on behalf of the City relative to this purchase. The vote was unanimous.

18. Solid Waste and Recycling Services – Competitive Procurement Process

Councilmember Buckland moved and Vice Mayor-Didbal seconded the motion to authorize the City Manager to enter in an agreement with Sloan Vazquez McAfee in the amount of \$66,570 to conduct a competitive procurement process for Solid Waste and Recycling Services and approve a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$73,227 from solid waste franchise fees. The motion passed with a vote of 3-2:
